On June 9, 10, and 11 nearly 60 leaders from GCC member congregations filled two rooms at Trinity Cathedral. GET OUT THE VOTE

Voter registration is about power for positive change. It is currently estimated that there are 200,000 eligible unregistered voters in Cuyahoga County alone. If we want to make an impact on the state policies in education, criminal justice, health care, and jobs that affect our region, we need to demonstrate the ability to get out the vote. There will be a GCC-wide voter registration training at Olivet Institutional Baptist Church on **Tuesday, July 24 at 7 pm**. This training will include a thorough workshop on who can register, how to complete forms accurately, and the best practices for engaging in conversation with potential voters. Additionally, we will allocate assignments for voter registration canvassing.

ACTION TEAM UPDATES

EDUCATION TEAM:

GCC's Education Team will be spending the summer meeting with CMSD parents to hear their ideas about their childrens' schools, their concerns about the upcoming budget cuts that will be implemented this fall, and their judgement about the proposed school funding levy. CRIMINAL JUSTICE TEAM:

After a healthy discussion about how GCC should address concerns about the death penalty in Ohio into our overall agenda, the Criminal Justice team voted unanimously to incorporate this issue into our work with the Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's office on eliminating racial disparities and overcharging. GCC's co-chairs met with Tim McGinty, the winner of the Democratic party primary for County Prosecutor, as he had committed at our Feb. 20 Candidate Forum. We are optimistic that this relationship, built on transparence and mutual accountability, will lead to real changes in how our county criminal justice system operates. Additionally, the Criminal Justice team will continue to be involved in the implementation of the Collateral Sanctions legislation sponsored by Senator Shirley Smith and recently signed into law by Governor John Kasich.

JOBS TEAM:

The first Job Hunters Group meeting was held at Trinity Cathedral on June 26th. The group is open to all who are seeking employment, no matter their stage in life. It continues to meet on **Tuesdays at 7 pm and Thursdays at 8 am** at Trinity Cathedral (2230 Euclid Ave.).
